### Renewed Paintings by Barbara Rumsey

We've been able to clean two small oil paintings because of the interest and help of five people. Loraine Nickerson, who spent years manning the Humane Society thrift shop, recognized the



paintings as the work of Anson Cross when they were donated there and handed them on to us a few years ago as significant artifacts. Cross ran one of the local art schools on the east side in the 1930s and 1940s. I remember local artist Ruth Gardner telling me she couldn't have learned perspective without Cross's device, a "drawing and painting glass."

Next, members Brenda Bettinson and Cordula Mathias, who've spent their lives in the art world, offered a donation for a worth-while project. Cleaning and reframing the two artworks seemed a natural to collections worker, Margaret Tew, who pitied the shape the paintings were in. It's always a good idea to listen carefully to her minor brainstorms and advice.

Margaret did the footwork to enlist the help of conservator Bette Pardoe of Alna to clean the paintings and Susan Brackett of Boothbay Harbor Framers to reframe them. We're very pleased to have returned these small but significant works of art to their former dignity. And I thank all involved with the effort for their unstinting assistance.
