




People have long been fascinated with Queen Marie Antoinette's dramatic 1793 beheading in a white death robe at the guillotine in France. This notoriety has prompted interest in her background and life. But did you know that she also had remarkable connections with Boothbay region sailors and sailing vessels?

In the last talk in our Summer Speaker Series, historian Chip Griffin explores these stories, which include transatlantic shipping and fishing. And of course, this discussion wouldn't be complete without including the Marie Antoinette house in our own backyard!

Mapping Maine: A Boothbay Region Historical Society Fundraiser

For the second year in a row, Boothbay Region Historical Society is fortunate enough to partner with Harbor Theater, bringing you special historical programming in their wonderful cinema setting. This year we are celebrating Maine's (and Boothbay's) cartographic history with a program entitled, *Mapping Maine*.

This packed evening includes a special abbreviated viewing of the MPBN "From the Vault" documentary, *Maine on the Map*, originally shown in 1996. The film focuses on early maps of Maine and includes the personal collection of Dr. Harold Osher, who donated his \$100 million collection to the Osher Map Library and Smith Center for Cartographic Education, located in Portland, Maine, in 2018.


Bringing the topic of maps into the present day and Boothbay region, the film will be followed by *The Romance Map of Maine: Boothbay Women and Pictorial Mapmaking in the 20th Century,* presented by Libby Bischof, Ph.D., Executive Director of the Osher Map Library. This talk uses a beautifully illustrated 1936 map of Maine, compiled by Boothbay schoolteacher Grace F. Dodge, and summer resident Alice Fowler, and illustrated by Mildred Greene to discuss the concept of pictorial maps, which rose to popularity in the

20th century.
