



On March 3rd, over 50 guests gathered at Bristol Marine Shipyard in Boothbay Harbor to hear Bristol's Ross Branch describe the yard's intensive restoration of the replica ship Eleanor. The original vessel was among those boarded by patriots during the Boston Tea Party in 1773. Guests were then treated to a tour of the work site to see the scope of work completed. We greatly appreciate the Bristol crew for allowing us to invade the yard during the final days of the refit. The replica was towed back home for more work and rerigging.

Thanks to a generous grant from the McEvoy Foundation and the cooperation of the Maine State Library, the Boothbay Region Historical Society and the Boothbay Register are finally able to begin work on a long-delayed project – digitizing all issues of the Register. The Register has been published continuously since December 1876. Digitizing the entire century and a half of the Register will both protect against deterioration of the oldest issues and make it possible to search entire Registers electronically, a huge leap forward for researchers.
