

Celebrating a successful fundraising event at the Leach House! Thanks to everyone who attended and our generous sponsors, we met our fundraising goal of \$6,000!

On September 13, 2025, the Society presented a unique evening at one of the oldest homes in the region. Located on Sawyers Island overlooking the Sheepscot River, the history of the Gray House (now Leach) reaches back into the 1700s, including a time when the house served as an inn and tavern for local residents and waterborne travelers. In 2007, the Gray House was added to the National Register of Historic Places.

cannon left from the War of 1812, and more. Later, guests gathered under a tent overlooking the water for taste bites and tavern lore intertwined with the history of Gray House. Well-known Maine food historian, Sandra Oliver, described early foods and beverages found in taverns and inns, as well as the average home. A buffet of food and beverage samples took guests back to that early era. Historical archaeologist, Tim Dinsmore, shared stories of early tavern life and more recent excavations at the Bryant-Barker tavern in Newcastle.

The Society is indebted to Sally Leach Sewall for once again opening her family's historic home for a fundraising event to support the Society. We would also like to honor the memory of Sally's sister, Susan. As a trustee, Susan was always enthusiastic about supporting the Society and sharing region history through exhibits, speakers, and events such as this house tour. Sally and Susan followed in the footsteps of their parents, Harry and Sally Leach, who first opened their home to the Society in 2006. The Leach family embodies the Society's mission to maintain and pass on the region's rich history.
